



Uniform Policy

Aims and Objectives

At East Ravendale CE Primary School we pride ourselves on looking smart by wearing our school uniform. Wearing a uniform allows children to demonstrate their pride in their school, both within school and when they are out in the local community and beyond. We also understand that the wearing of a uniform reduces peer pressure and promotes a sense of community within the school. We also believe that the wearing of uniform at primary school prepares children for both their next stage of education and the world of work. We hope that all groups of children will take a sense of pride in their appearance whilst they are in school.

When is a uniform required?

Children are required to always wear uniform to school from when they are registered in Reception.

All pupils must wear school uniform when representing the school at events off school property unless otherwise stated. Children are ambassadors for the school at all times, and never more so than when attending trips or visits as a school or class group. Children should wear their uniform with pride, as it identifies them as children of East Ravendale CE Primary School.

Children should wear the PE uniform whenever they are taking part in either curriculum PE or any sporting events both within and outside of school.

Jewellery and Make-up

Children with pierced ears may wear one pair of stud earrings only to school. For safety reasons no other items of jewellery are allowed. Staff reserve the right to ask children to remove items of jewellery, deemed unsuitable, which will be kept in school until being able to be returned to parents.

Children must not wear make-up or nail polish to school.

In extreme circumstances and/or where a parent refuses to support the school policy, the school will take additional measures in line with school, Trust and LA guidance.

The Role of Parents

We ask all parents who send their children to East Ravendale CE Primary School to support this policy. We believe that parents have a duty to send their children correctly dressed and ready for learning. One of the responsibilities of parents is to ensure that their child has the correct uniform, and that it is clean and in good repair.

If parents or carers find themselves struggling to provide any aspect of our school uniform please speak to a member of staff, in confidence, who will be able to assist through accessing support – for example through the Love As Action, Together Fund.

What if a child does not wear a uniform?



The Headteacher will decide what to do if a child's appearance is judged to be inappropriate. If a child arrives at school, dressed inappropriately, they will be provided with spare uniform and parents will be informed.

The Headteacher is responsible for enforcing this uniform policy and has the full support of the school's governors.

EYFS – Y5

- Royal blue cardigan or jumper with school logo
- White or blue polo shirt/blouse
- Grey or black trousers/skirt/shorts
- In the summer blue and white gingham or striped dresses
- Socks and tights – grey/white/black
- Black shoes

Year 6

- As above but with a maroon cardigan or jumper with school logo

PE

- Academy logo PE top
- Blue/black shorts or leggings
- Trainers
- Navy blue hoodie or sweatshirt – plain or with school logo

In the winter pupils may choose to wear leggings or jogging bottoms and a hooded sweatshirt. These should be plain blue or black.

All items of clothing must be clearly labelled.
